MiniBar → Hidden inside the Franklin Avenue
Hollywood Hills Hotel, MiniBar, conceived by restaurateur
Warner Ebbink, chef Brandon Boudet, and locally and
London-based designer Shawn Hausman is a one-room
concept with a '70s glam aesthetic. The three had worked
together on a number of projects before, including Little
Doms in Los Feliz, and looked forward to collaborating again.
"We wanted to create a classic, timeless, sexy bar—a little
gem tucked away in Hollywood," says Hausman's partner
Jessica Kimberley. Its small size, initially cause for some
concern, ultimately added to the appeal of the intimate, 32seat lounge.

At the center of the room stands a padded red leather bar with an underlit countertop and suspended glassware. The deep red tone works alongside wood touches and brass highlights, which add a dramatic effect to the moody space. Vintage sconces illuminate the fabric-paneled walls, and refurbished blue and white captain's chairs on castors can glide across the dark carpeted floor. Gold-dipped tables and '70s-style barstools are a swanky addition to the cozy bar, perfect for the Hollywood crowd.
